Medical Relief Missions Short term projects where medical missions to Sudan where a group of specialists would provide immediate care, surgical interventions and training.

Telemedicine Initiatives

Technology is utilized to provide remote consultations, diagnostic, treatment plan and specialist advice that may be deficient in Sudan.



Training and Knowledge Transfer

Establishing training workshop either online or in person in areas of modern medical techniques, management of disease and other relevant areas.

Fundraising and Resource Mobilization

Utilize connections to raise funds, collect medical supplies to support the healthcare services in Sudan.



Collaboration with International Entities

Act as intermediaries between Sudanese health institutions and international organizations, facilitate collaboration findings and other support mechanisms.

Research and Documentation

Conducting research on specific health challenges faced by Sudan to advocate for international awareness and guide evidence-based interventions.



Mental Health and Trauma Services Offering remote psychological counselling, trauma therapy, and training local counselors to handle the psychological aftermath of conflict.

Policy Advising

Provide guidance on health policy formulation and implementation drawing from best practices observed in their respective countries.



Diaspora Association

To form or strengthen associations of Sudanese health professionals abroad by creating platforms, collaboration and networking.

Infrastructure Development Contribute to the building of healthcare infrastructure from clinics to major hospitals



Scholarship Programs

Offers scholarships to support various educational programs to enable students and medical professionals to advance their training in Sudan.

Health System Strengthening Use experience to develop Sudan health systems such as electronic records for safer patients' care.





Peacebuilding Through Health

Being a unifying theme, collaborative health projects potentially foster unity, trust and promote peacebuilding.

Public Health Campaigns

Guide and Support public health campaigns in pressing issues like infectious disease, maternal & child health and nutrition



ADAPTING TO THE WAR



 Forming sub-committee within the SDU-UK to allocate tasks.

 Choose smaller, effective and realistic projects such as supporting healthcare centers and capacity building for local hospitals.

• Utilize strategies that are practical and efficient e.g., Telemedicine, distance learning for students and doctors.

ADAPTING TO THE WAR



 Collaboration and exchanging ideas with other bodies and international organizations.

 Supporting the provision of services for civilians that are now refugees and displaced.

SDU-UK CHALLENGES



1. The absence of safe passages and humanitarian corridors since the war erupted.

2. No exact figures about the scale of the health catastrophe, the number displaced citizens and the extent of infrastructure destruction.

3. The plight of those suffering in silence such as rape victims, chronic illnesses.

4. Reports of emerging outbreaks of infectious diseases and natural disasters e.g., floods.
