Your Excellencies Presidents Michel, Sassoli and von der Leyen

One of the greatest success stories of the EU in the last decade is the European Research Council (ERC). Thanks to its unique formula of independence from political intervention, high scientific standards and strict adherence to peer review, ERC grants have become one of the most prestigious research grants in the world.

In light of the current European focus on the most challenging research projects, we call on the EU to increase its focus to four a cut across all areas of Horizon Europe, and we anticipate that this would also impact the world.

We recognise the signatures of this petition, call upon the Heads of State and Government to increase their support for the ERC in Horizon Europe, the next European framework programme for Research and Innovation.

Protecting and improving the ERC budget will secure continued funding to the ERC which pushes the boundaries of our knowledge and continues to strongly support Europe's a dynamic knowledge society.

The ERC is a major reason for Europe's increasing strength in science. The ERC funds some of the most popular top prize products of the world's high-quality scientific publications. It is therefore of paramount importance that the EU continues to develop and increase its strength in Horizon Europe.

The ERC invests in top researchers in Europe, giving them

the freedom to follow their scientific curiosity. Based on scientific excellence, the ERC supports research that is pushing the very frontiers of knowledge through competitive funding. This has led to many breakthroughs in science. The ERC is a vital tool helping Europe to attract and retain the brightest minds, and to establish itself as a scientific powerhouse.

Today, science is more than ever seen which is the most successful and inspiring way to innovation. With increased funding, many more scientific breakthroughs are possible, with a high degree of certainty.

We recognise the ERC as the most important European programme in science and technology for the future of Horizon Europe, the next European framework programme for Research and Innovation.

This investment in ground-breaking research has already paid off. It has led to countless breakthroughs, nurtured science-based spin-offs and caused a greater impetus for research-based spin-offs.

With this open petition letter, we urge the EU to protect the funding of the European Research Council in the long-term budget of the EU.

#### ERC HIGHLIGHTS

75% of completed projects led to breakthrough or major advances.

7 Nobel Prizes, 4 Kavli Prizes, 4 Fields Medals, dozens of important prizes awarded to ERC grantees.

Over 9,500 top researchers have been funded, with 2/3 of grants under 40 years old.

Over 70,000 team members, mostly PhD students and

post-docs/researchers – training the next generation of excellent researchers

ERC research led to over 100,000 articles published, with more than 5,500 articles in the 10 most cited international scientific journals.

ERC projects have led to over 1,200 patent applications and over 100 new ventures.


