## **Introduction to IPBES (Naturpanelet)**


IPBES, the Intergovernmental Panel on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services, has over the last decade been instrumental in developing science policy and science diplomacy around nature conservation and management. The landmark IPBES global assessment from 2019 presented the most comprehensive evidence showing Nature's dangerous decline and the need for transformative change to restore and protect nature. IPBES continues its mission to strengthen policy and decisions, specifically through assessing the state of knowledge on biodiversity and nature's contributions to people and capacity-building.











The event will provide an opportunity to engage with IPBES to learn more about its work, including the latest approved assessment on Alien species and the ongoing assessments Nexus (biodiversity, water, food, health) and Transformative change. It also provides a unique opportunity to connect IPBES experts and likeminded people interested in and working on topics related to biodiversity and Nature's contribution to people.
