Open-ended deadline	Research	ICT research (link) The Research Council of Norway has published a call for Researcher Project for ICT Renewal and Development. «The purpose of this call is to promote innovation and development in research that can contribute to advancing the international research front in ICT, including digital security and sovereignty, the next generation of data processing/ICT systems and other ICT research areas. The research will contribute to sustainable social development. The call is aimed at researchers who have demonstrated the ability to conduct research of high scientific quality.»
15.01.2025	Collaborative research	Al centres (main) (link)  "The purpose of this call is to establish four to six research centres for artificial intelligence (Al centres) that will conduct research on high-quality artificial intelligence and address important societal and industry-related challenges. The Al centres will collectively cover the three tracks — impacts, technology and innovation. The three tracks overlap and must be seen in context. Submission of an outline by the deadline of 7 June 2024 is mandatory and is the first part of the application process for this call. The main difference between the two lies in where the funding comes from and which countries receive the funding."
